

Family Options for School iPads – 2011-2012

Option 1: Check out iPad for home-school access.

- 1) Student agrees to fully comply with all terms of the Shoreline Laptop Agreement and District Network Policy. Failure to comply may result in loss of iPad privileges and/or disciplinary action.
- 2) Student pays annual technology fee for iPad insurance and agrees to insurance terms for any claim(s) resulting from theft and/or accidental damage; in cases of negligence as defined in the iPad agreement, student may be responsible for the full cost of repairs.
- 3) Provisions for parental control settings on the iPad can be arranged with district or school IT staff. Families wishing to purchase and install additional parental controls must coordinate this with IT staff.

Option 2: Access to laptop or iPad for classroom activities and parent-provided home access.

- 1) A limited supply of laptops and iPads will be available for student check-out when they are needed for classroom activities; devices are unlikely to be available for student use if they are not part of that day's class work per teacher notification. Each school will make provisions for some level of supplemental access to computers during the school day, such as in the library.
- 2) Option 2 devices will have all standard Shoreline software installed, but students may not be able to save work to these devices; instead they will need to utilize student servers, USB drives, email, or other means to move work between school and home. The iPads in particular are ill-suited for check-out usage as key functionality depends on student accounts to online services.
- 3) Families choosing not to receive a district iPad for full school/home access assume responsibility for providing adequate computer access at home for the completion of school assignments. Teachers will be planning instruction on the assumption that students have home computer access to complete work.
- 4) Students will be responsible for checking teacher web sites or other online publication of assignments, due dates, documents, etc.
- 5) Students using in-school devices are expected to follow all existing standards of acceptable use and care/handling. Damages resulting from intentional abuse or neglect will result in appropriate fees for repair costs. Misuse of the devices can result in disciplinary action and potential loss of access.
