Summer capital projects enhance District buildings



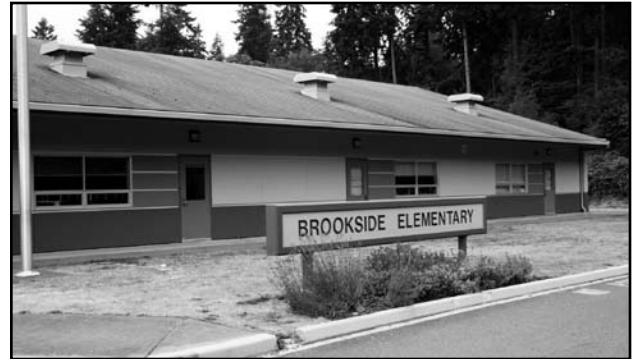

High school design teams complete their work



For more than a year, volunteers have been serving on design teams planning for the replacement/modernization of Shorecrest (right) and Shorewood (above) High Schools.

The design teams were made up of staff and parents from each high school and community representatives from each of the middle schools and elementary schools on the respective sides of the District.

Each team held three community meetings to gather input from the public, which the architects used to help create the preferred



designs for Shorecrest and Shorewood. Models of the designs are now on display at the two high schools and site plans can be viewed on the District Web site, www.shorelineschools.org.

The Shoreline School Board is considering placing a bond issue on the February 9, 2010 ballot to fund the replacement/modernization of both Shorecrest and Shorewood.
