

## Seattle-King County Immigrant Legal Defense Network

**Have you or someone you know received a notice from immigration court or been detained by ICE?**

**If you are in need of immigration legal services and cannot pay for them, the Seattle-King County Immigrant Legal Defense Network may be able to help.**

**You must be low-income and work in the city of Seattle or live in King County to qualify.**

Earlier in 2017, both Seattle and King County passed legislation authorizing \$1.5 million to fund a network of community-based nonprofit organizations to provide FREE legal aid to immigrants and refugees in detention, facing deportation, or in danger of losing their immigration status.
