## Help your child prepare for end of year projects

Teachers often assign students large projects toward the end of the school year. To help your child tackle a large project:

- **Make a plan.** Sit down with your child to develop a plan for completing the project. Have her write the due date on the calendar. Ask questions about what steps she'll need to take to get ready. "You need to make a poster. Let's check to see if we have the supplies you'll need."
- **Make a schedule.** Now help your child figure out when she's going to complete each step. Having several smaller deadlines is much easier than trying to meet one big one. Have her write these dates on the calendar.
- **Celebrate successes.** Each time your child reaches a goal, help her figure out a reward. This should be small (a favorite dessert, not a trip to an amusement park) and something she can mostly do for herself.
- **Check in.** You'll need to see how she is progressing to help her stay on track.

## Early Release Wednesdays 2018-19

The Shoreline School Board has approved the proposal to have students released early on Wednesdays that fall in 5 day weeks. This will begin in the 2018-19 school year with early release at 1:50 p.m. Moving forward with this plan will eliminate non-student days so that our students attend 180 days rather than only 175. More information on after school options will be provided later. These options will include tuition-based extended care and enrichment activities at every elementary school; scholarship vouchers will be available to students who receive free or reduced price lunch. Although adjusting to this schedule will pose challenges for some families, there will be more opportunities over the course of the year for our staff to work together and further improve the great work happening at your child's school.
