I also shared the login information for using our district's paid-subscription to the Culturegrams database. Culturegrams provides concise, reliable, and up-to-date reports on more than 200 countries, each U.S. state, and all 13 Canadian provinces and territories. Take these everyday steps to protect the health of students: Please review with your child.



- * Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. Or cough in the elbow.
- * Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.
- * Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- * Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- * If your child is sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.) Keep away from others as much as possible to keep from making others sick.
