Community/District Characteristics

The Shoreline School District is located immediately north of the city limits of Seattle in King County. The district is bordered by the Edmonds, Northshore, and Seattle School Districts, as well as Puget Sound and Lake Washington. It serves the cities of Shoreline and Lake Forest Park, which cover about 15.4 square miles and have a combined population of about 68,000. These cities are established residential communities, highly desired by newcomers because of the quality of the district's schools. The district has about 9560 students, and uses a 7-2-4 plan. Shorecrest is one of two high schools in the district.

School Information

- Four year public high school
- Comprehensive program with specialized courses for students of all academic abilities. Includes AVID program.
- Feeders: 4 elementaries, 1 middle school
- Two 90-day semesters per year
- Typically, students take six classes per semester, and earn six credits per year
- 150 hours of instruction equals 1.0 credit
- Block schedule; three classes each day, meeting alternate days (minutes per class each week: average 300 minutes)
- Student population Oct. 2017: 1416 (WIAA league: WESCO 3A)
- Ethnic composition: 13.98% Asian, 1.17% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 9.24% Black, 55.48% Caucasian, 6.96% Hispanic, 12.82% Multi, 0.35% Native American
- Free and Reduced Lunch: 30.72%
- Special Education (IEP): 8.33%
- ELL (ESL): 2.25%

- 1.0 Fine Arts credit
- 1.0 Occupational/CTE/Voc credit
- 1.0 World Language credit
- 4.5 Elective credits

In addition to the above credits, the following endorsements are required for graduation:

- 40 hours of Community Service
- completion of a High School & Beyond Plan
- completion of Washington State History
- fulfillment of state exit-exam requirements

**Note: World Language and Algebra I/Geometry classes taken and passed at the middle school level are applicable towards graduation requirements, per Washington state law.*

Grading System

Grade point averages are computed in terms of letter grades only. A "pass" grade (P) satisfies course requirements but is not used in GPA. No courses' grades are weighted. The Class of 2015 is the last one for which Rank was run, per School Board policy.
