Welcome Letter to Parents/Guardians from the Food and Nutrition Services Director

August 2022

Greetings,

I would like to extend a warm welcome to the Shoreline/Lake Forest Park community from your school Food and Nutrition Services Department! The Food and Nutrition Services Department operates 14 school cafeterias, family-style meal service at the Edwin Pratt Early Learning Center (EPELC), and the Central Kitchen.

Services include:

- Daily breakfast, beginning 15-30 minutes before the first bell.
- Daily lunch at each school
- Daily breakfast, lunch and snack served in the classroom at the EPELC
- Free summer meals program

The Food and Nutrition Services Department operates as an enterprise program by balancing the budget through meal sales, a la carte sales, and State/Federal reimbursements; the program’s financial goal is not to rely on the general fund for support. **The USDA school meal waiver, that provided free meals for all students, expired on June 30. Since Congress has not voted to extend the program, Shoreline Public Schools will return to pre-pandemic operations for the 2022-2023 school year.** Our mission is to alleviate childhood hunger within the community and increase student success by providing and promoting a nutritionally balanced diet in a warm and friendly environment.

Our highly trained staff treats food safety and customer service as their highest priority. We work hard to develop healthy and appetizing meals for the students. Many of the foods are made from scratch using the best ingredients; including low-fat proteins, whole grain pastas, fresh fruits and vegetables, locally sourced bread, and hormone-free milk. The menus are analyzed and recipes adjusted to ensure they meet USDA nutrition guidelines for each age group for calories, sodium, and saturated fat.

Choice and variety are important to students, so our menu is planned to provide options including a daily vegetarian entrée and salad bars. We are sensitive to the various nutritional needs of our students. If your child has an allergy to any food, please contact your school nurse.

A lunch is made up of five basic food components: milk, meat or meat alternate, vegetable, fruit, and grain. Students must select at least three of these components for a complete reimbursable meal (one of which must be a vegetable or fruit). Individual meal components purchased by themselves such as milk, apple juice, snacks, and second entrees are considered a la carte purchases and are not covered by free reimbursable meal benefits.

Purchasing a meal is very easy. Every student is assigned a student ID that is tied to his or her meal account; students enter their ID number or use a barcode card to pay at the register. The meal account is similar to a checking account, where purchases are deducted from funds applied to the account. Funds can be applied by cash or check paid to the kitchen cashier or the Food and Nutrition Services office. Balances carry-over year to year while the student is attending any of the schools in the Shoreline Public School District (there is a \$20 returned check fee.). Online credit and debit card payments are available by following the payment link on the District website: <https://wa-shoreline.intouchrecepting.com/>. Your student's account balance and purchase statement can be viewed by logging into Family Access.

Extra entrees and a la carte snacks and drinks can only be purchased if there is money on the student's account to pay for the items being purchased. If a student's account goes into the negative, an automated e-mail and/or phone call will be sent to the parent/guardian to ensure that negative charges do not accrue drastically before the parent/guardian is made aware. Items will not be available for purchase until negative meal debt is paid in full. The entire School District meal charge procedure can be found in the Board Policy Manual 8200P.

The Food and Nutrition Services Department participates in the National School Lunch Program, which is a federally funded program that assists in providing nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free complete meals to students each school day. Attached to this letter is an application for free and reduced-price meals; it is also available at your student's school and electronically on the Food Services page on the District website. Electronic applications are also available by accessing the Food Service tab in your Family Access account. **One application per family must be fully completed each school year** and returned to the Food and Nutrition Services office by mail, e-mail, or dropped off at your student's school. The online application will automatically be sent to us when it is submitted. **Households must** have their applications approved before the subsidy will apply; until that time, full charges will accrue. Parents/guardians are highly encouraged to submit the application as soon as possible to avoid these charges because it will be their responsibility to pay back any fee accrual. Once the application is processed, a benefit notification letter will be sent to families via email and/or mail.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

This letter tells how your children can get free or reduced-price meals, as well as information on other benefits. The cost of school meals is shown below.

Breakfast and lunch will be served at no cost to those children who qualify for free and reduced-price meals in grades K-12. All other students will be charged the rates shown below.

Who should fill out an application?

Fill out the application if:

- Total household income is the SAME or LESS than the amount on the chart.
- You receive Basic Food, take part in the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) for your children.
- You are applying for foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court.

Be sure to submit ONLY ONE application per household. We will notify you if the application is approved or denied. If any child you are applying for is homeless (McKinney-Vento), or migrant, check the appropriate box.

What counts as income? Who is considered a member of my household?

Look at the income chart below. Find your household size. Find your total household income. If members in the household are paid at different times during the month and you are unsure if your household is eligible, fill out an application and we will determine your income eligibility for you. The information you give will be used to determine your child's eligibility for free or reduced-price meals.

Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals regardless of personal use income. If you have questions about applying for meal benefits for foster children, please contact us at 206-393-4209.

HOUSEHOLD is defined as all persons, including parents, children, grandparents, and all people related or unrelated who live in your home and share living expenses. If applying for a household with a foster child, you may include the foster child in the total household size.

HOUSEHOLD INCOME is considered to be the income each household member received before taxes. This includes wages, social security, pension, unemployment, welfare, child support, alimony, and any other cash income. If including a foster child as part of the household, you must also include the foster child's personal income. Do not report foster payments as income.

What must be on the application?

A. For households not getting any assistance:

- Student name(s)
- Names of all household members
- Income by source for all household members
- Adult household member's signature
- Last 4 digits of social security number of the adult household member who signs the application (or if the adult signing does not have a social security number, check the associated box).

Complete *Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5; Part 6* is optional.

B. For households with only foster child(ren)

- Student's name
- Adult household member signature

Complete *Parts 1 and 5; Part 6* is optional. You may also send the school a copy of the court documentation showing the foster child(ren) was/were placed with you instead of filling out an application form.

Last 4 digits of SSN are not required for B.

C. For a family getting Basic Food/TANF/FDPIR:

- List all student names
 - Enter a case number
 - Adult household member's signature
- Complete *Parts 1, 2, 4, and 5. Part 6 is optional.*
Last 4 digits of SSN are not required for C.

D. For household with a foster child(ren) and other children:

Apply as a household and include foster children. Follow the directions for “**A. For households not getting any assistance:**” and include the foster child’s personal use income.

What if I’m not receiving basic food dollars?

If you have been approved for Basic Food but do not actually receive Basic Food dollars, you may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. You must apply for meal benefits by filling out a meal application and returning it to your child’s school.

Do my children automatically qualify if they have a case number?

Yes. Children on TANF or Basic Food may get free meals and children receiving some Medicaid benefits may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals without the household having to complete an application. These children are identified by the school using a data matching process. This matched list is then made available to your child’s school food service staff. The students on this list get free meals if their schools have the free and reduced-price breakfast and/or lunch program (not all schools do). Please contact us immediately if you feel your children should be receiving free meals and are not. If you do not want your child to participate in the free meal programs using this method, please notify the school.

If anyone in my household has a case number, will all children qualify for free meals?

Yes. If someone else in the household has a case number, other than a foster child, you must fill out an application and send it to your student’s school. Please contact us immediately if you feel other children in your household should be receiving free meals and are not.

Basic Food - Can I qualify for assistance in buying food?

Basic Food is the state’s food stamp program. It helps households make ends meet by providing monthly benefits to buy food. Getting Basic Food is easy! You can apply in person at the local DSHS Community Service Office, by mail, or online. There are other benefits too. You can learn about Basic Food by calling 1-877-501-2233 or by logging on to <https://www.dshs.wa.gov/esa/community-services-offices/basic-food>.

We are in the military. Do we report our income differently?

Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.

My child’s application was approved last year. Do I need to fill out a new one?

Yes. Your child’s application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

What if some household members have no income to report?

Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.

What if my child needs special foods?

If your child needs special foods, contact the school/district food service office.

Proof of Eligibility

The information you provide may be verified at any time. You may be asked to send additional information to prove your child is eligible to receive free and reduced-price meals.

Fair Hearing

If you do not agree with the decision on your child's application or the process used to prove income eligibility, you may talk with Jessica Jandayan, the fair hearing official. You have the right to a fair hearing which may be arranged by calling the school/school district at this number 206-393-4209.

Reapplication

You may apply for benefits any time during the school year. If you should have a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, or become unemployed, or receive Basic Food, TANF, or FDPIR, you may be eligible for benefits and may fill out an application at that time.
