ARTICLE IV: Legislative Branch

Section 1: Legislative powers of the ASB shall be vested in a Student Council. The Council shall consist of one elected representative from each homeroom and the ASB Cabinet. The remaining class officers and Activity Coordinator shall attend all meetings having voice, but no vote.

****April 2018 - student council approved a new system for Student Council to test out for the 2018-2019 school year. We will decide after the first semester if we want to continue the new practice, or permanently change language in the constitution for the new format.**

2. December 14th Meeting
 - a. Middle School Committee Recommendations
 - i. The proposition that ALL students take academically rigorous courses in the Honors offerings.
 1. Teachers will receive professional development focused on but not limited to:
 - a. High expectations for all students
 - b. Culturally responsive practices
 - c. Recognizing implicit bias in instruction and interactions with students
 - ii. 6th graders have the ability to take quarter-long electives, which provide more exposure to potential fields of interest
 1. Year long electives would still be an option
 - iii. The instrumental program at the elementary level should be reviewed
 - iv. All students will participate in developmentally responsive advisory time designed to address the unique social and emotional needs of adolescents
 - v. Class and schedule configurations allow for teaming and common groupings when possible
