March 22, 2019 School Board Report

1. March 4th Joint Meeting with Shoreline Community College Board of Trustees:
 - a. 220 Shoreline School District Students are enrolled in Running Start
 - b. The Edwin Pratt Early Learning Center employs a “braided model” with classes that blend fee-based and income-based students.
 - i. In accordance with the SSD Race and Equity Policy and its mission.
 - c. The Highly Capable student population is not reflective of the diversity of the student population.
 - i. Testing is now administered at all schools during school hours, and High-Cap services are also available at all schools.
 - d. The SCC automotive department is in a new partnership with TESLA.
 - i. Automotive Technician Certification has a TESLA branch option.
 - e. New apartments, 7000 Campus Living, will be open fall quarter 2019.
 - i. Singles, doubles, quads, and community living space.
 - ii. 68 units.
 - iii. Request form for housing is already active. Housing is filled on a first-come-first-serve basis.
 - f. The Honors college.
 - i. Max 20 students in H.C. classes.
 - ii. Advanced courses.
 - iii. Community connections.
 - iv. Extremely beneficial for students looking to transfer to 4-year universities.
2. March 4th Regular Meeting:
 - a. Action Items.
 - i. Adoption of Proposed 2019-2020 Use of North City Elementary Campus.
 1. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the North City Elementary Campus will be available for use.
 2. Long-term use has yet to be determined as unexpected enrollment drops this year delayed the collection and presentation of information to appropriate parties.
 3. 2019-2020 Options:
 - a. Reduce K-3, Overflow K at North City

- b. Reduce K-3, Overflow K at North City & Meridian Park
 - c. Reduce K-2, Overflow K at North City
 - d. Reduce K-3, All K classrooms at North City
 - 4. Option B is being recommended so that the flooring replacement and field renovation at North City can be completed as scheduled, and students can remain as close to their neighborhood school as possible.
 - ii. Approval of 2019-2020 Tuition Rates for Shoreline Children's Center Programs.
 - 1. The preschool program is self sustaining, is funded by tuition.
 - 2. The proposed rates for 2019-2020 reflect a 7–9.3% increase in tuition.
 - a. Preschool program is adding program support to meet state licensing requirements.
 - b. Will allow families who qualify to access state subsidies for preschool and childcare.
 - c. Increases professional development support for staff to meet credentials required for licensing.
 - d. Adds capacity to maintain staffing ratios.
 - e. Increase in labor rates.
 - b. Community Comments:
 - i. Parent and advocate for Mandarin in Shoreline Schools: There is a disparity between Mandarin services at Kellogg and Einstein. At the 6th grade visit and open-house, there was no Chinese cultural experience. In general, there is no visibility and awareness of the program; many students are not even aware that it exists on the eastside. Kellogg Mandarin is phasing out, so please address this issue as soon as possible as the registration deadline is approaching. All languages deserve to be represented and advocated for equally.

 - a. Recognition of All State Musicians.
 - i. 23 high school music students were selected to the 2019 Washington Music Educators Association (WMEA) High School All-State Honor Groups.
 - ii. Four middle school students were selected to the Junior All-State Groups.
 - b. Update on Projects and Finances.
 - i. The 2006 bonds, in the amount of \$149,500,000.

1. Used to address facility upgrades and systems improvements across the district in five areas:
 - a. Technology (prior to the approval of a separate Technology Levy)
 - b. Health, Safety, and Security
 - c. Renovate and Improve Existing Buildings
 - d. Renovate and Improve Existing Athletic/Physical Education Fields and Facilities
 - e. Design Upgrades or Replacement for Shorecrest and Shorewood High Schools
- ii. The 2010 bonds, in the amount of \$150,000,000.
 1. Used to build Shorewood and Shorecrest High Schools.
- iii. The 2017 bonds, in the amount of \$250,000,000.
 1. Used to build four new schools:
 - a. Early Learning Center (replacement for the former Shoreline Children's Center)
 - b. Parkwood Elementary School
 - c. Einstein Middle School
 - d. Kellogg Middle School
- c. January 2019 Financial Update and February + March 2019 Enrollment Update.
