This year's book fair was a rousing success. I know, I say that every year. But I have the numbers to back it up. With net sales over \$16,000 (which is \$3,000 more than last year), the school received about \$4,000 to purchase books for the Echo Lake library. But the best part for me was the free books given to every student. The PTA donated over \$5,000 to make this happen. Watching students selecting a book of their choice was heartwarming, and a perfect educational gift! A huge thanks to all the parent, community, and former student volunteers who have their time at the book fair. Without them, the book fair isn't possible. And a special thanks to Mrs. Bowhay's 4th grade classroom who broke down the book fair, and returned the library to its regular state in record time. You were Awesome!

The first week of May, 519 Echo Lake students voted for their favorite Washington Children's Choice Picture Book Award (WCCPBA). This award comes from a list of 20 books selected by parents, librarians, and community members each year. These books were read to the students by me, or the classroom teachers over the school year. This year's winners were:

Sergeant Reckless: The True Story of the Little Horse Who Became a Hero (84 votes)

Legend of Rock, Paper, Scissors (79 votes)

Woodpecker Wants a Waffle (60 votes)


I will announce the all-region winners as soon as the results are published. All 20 titles are now available for students to check out.

This is also a good time to break up counter-productive combinations of children and nurture productive relationships.

We welcome input about your child's strengths, needs, special circumstances, or other information that might be helpful. Student Placement forms are now available in the office. If you are interested, please return this form by Friday, May 31st. Placement forms are an opportunity for families to provide us with information we may not know. Please note that we do not accept requests for a specific teacher.

Due to last minute changes in student enrollment and other changes that may occur over the summer, you will not learn of your child's classroom assignment until closer to the start of school in August. If you know now that you aren't returning, please call our office staff to let them know. We work very hard to find the best placement for each child. Thank you for your support!
