Anticipate Junior Year

If you are aiming for college, figure out a plan for the search process.

Plan for Testing (tentative)

If you know you are college bound, plan to take the PSAT in the fall of junior year: PSAT registration will *not* be automatic, you will sign up with the Shorewood Business Office.

Also plan to take the SAT and possibly the ACT later in junior year. If possible, all juniors will take a School Day SAT in the spring; registration for that will be automatic.

If you are motivated for testing, do some prep over the summer. Create an account and see Khan Academy on <u>collegeboard.org</u>.

Talk about \$

Have a family discussion about future possibilities and \$. If you are considering college, use a couple of Net Price Calculators on college websites (search using the college name and "net price calculator"). The sticker price of a college isn't necessarily your family's net price.

Attend a college fair or other events
